

What is The National Jamboree? The National Jamboree is a gathering, or jamboree, of thousands of members of Scouting America, usually held every four years and organized by the National Council of Scouting America. Referred to as "the Jamboree", "Jambo", or NSJ, Scouts from all over the nation and world have the opportunity to attend. The 2026 National Jamboree will be July 22-31 (additional dates for the Council Contingent tour will be added).

Where: The BSA National Jamboree is held at the Summit Bechtel Reserve in West Virginia. The Summit is a training, Scouting, and adventure center for the millions of youth and adults involved in Scouting America and anyone who loves the outdoors.

Who Can Attend the Jamboree? To attend the National Jamboree, a Scout must: Be a currently registered member of Scouting America in a Scouts BSA troop, Venturing Crew or Sea Scout Ship: If attending as a member of Scouts BSA, a Scout must be at least 12 years of age and no older than 17 years of age. If attending as a member of a Venturing Crew or Sea Scout Ship, a Scout must be at least 13 years old and have completed the eighth grade or is age 14 and not yet 21 years of age.

Cost: \$5,100 (estimate) per youth participant. Cost includes pre-Jamboree tour, Jamboree fees, food, travel (airfare/buses) and more. Secure your spot for the 2026 National Jamboree today with a \$100 deposit. The Jamboree payment plan will soon be released. Scan to QR code to place your \$100 deposit to guarantee your spot no later than March 13th.
